Eligibility Criteria

- **FIVB Eligibility:** All athletes must hold a NZ Passport and possess NZ Federation of Origin status, having first engaged in competitive Volleyball in New Zealand upon turning 14.
- Age Criteria: Determined by the event in the corresponding year (as indicated below).
- **Document Completion:** Athletes must fulfil all required documentation, including but not limited to FIVB, Volleyball NZ, and Drug Free Sport NZ.

Commitment to the programme

To represent New Zealand is an exceptional opportunity and one that holds the potential to be a once-in-alifetime experience! We regard these opportunities with utmost importance, along with your ongoing growth as an athlete. Bearing this in mind, we have engaged in discussions with our coaches, and they strongly recommend that you have the following:

- Access as many quality training environments and competitions as possible (Financially/logistically)
- A viable and transparent conditioning programme that you are following

We acknowledge your existing commitments during this period yet grasping these supplementary competitive experiences will undoubtedly play a pivotal role in your development and enhance your prospects of success leading up to Asian Champs and subsequent events including G.J. Gardner Homes NZBT, Asian/World Tour

When travelling and competing, the athletes will remain in the care and administration of VNZ, coaches and managers, while participating. Volleyball New Zealand will lead all elements of the programme.

Asian Championships Selection

A maximum of two teams (4 athletes per gender) will be selected to represent New Zealand at Asian Under 19 Beach Volleyball Championships in 2024.

- An Additional Information form and trial registration will need to completed by November 17
- All athletes will then be required to join a zoom call during November to establish connections and discuss expectations around the selection process.
- Trials will be completed in both North and South Island to allow accessibility. Athletes will be required to attend either trial but not both. It is expected that all trialists play in the abovementioned events following the trial. This allows coaches to observe athletes in competition. Although preferred, athletes do not need to play with someone from the trial in these events.
- Estimated 8-10 athletes will then be invited to a final selection trial held at Mount Maunganui 21-22. Intention is to have two sessions scheduled in the morning and afternoon around the NZBT so athletes can watch the finals. Monday will be finished by midday.
- Any athlete still competing in NZBT on Sunday won't be required to trial on Sunday and workload will be discussed around involvement on Monday
- Final team selections of 4 athletes (2 teams) and 2 non travelling reserves will be made following this final trial
- Once final selections are made, individual training and team plans will be discussed via zoom calls. Non travelling reserves will be included in these
- We are awaiting competition dates from Asian Volleyball Confederation (AVC) which may impact a few things (but not limited to the following):

- If Asian Champs are scheduled for March this may impact your involvement in NZSS Indoor Nationals
- If Asian Champs are scheduled in June may impact your involvement in IPC
- It is under our expectation that the likely competition dates will fall in April May based on previous years

World Championships Qualification

The five highest-placing countries at the Asian Under 19 Beach Volleyball Championships will be granted spots in the Main Draw of the World Championships. Each of these spots is limited to one team per country.

If any of the countries that finish in the top 5 at the Asian Championships decline their place in the World Championships, a wildcard entry may be given to the highest-placing country not already qualified. This wildcard serves as an additional opportunity for countries to participate in the World Championships.

Volleyball New Zealand will conduct a separate selection process for the team that will represent New Zealand in the World Under 19 Beach Volleyball Championships. This selection process is not automatically granted to the highest-placing team at the Asian Championships.

Costs

Volleyball New Zealand wish to support all national athletes where possible. Current estimated costs can be seen below. These costs include but are not limited to venue hire, all coach associated costs, uniform (when travelling), training equipment, VNZ operational costs.

- December Trial \$100
- Squad Camps \$100 (estimated)
- Estimated Asian Champs \$6000 (estimated)
- Estimated World Champs \$6000 (estimated) *Please note all costs exclude GST*

Trials – All athletes will be responsible for their own travel, accommodation, and food Camps – All athletes will be responsible for their own travel, accommodation, and food. Athletes may be asked to billet, where possible food will be provided Events – All costs will be factored in excluding personal expenses and items

Please note: additional trainings/camps may be added and will be covered at the athletes expense.

Cost equalization

Cost equalization will be implemented with preparation camps where possible

Uniform

- Trial Uniform:
 - Athletes are required to provide their own trial uniform for the selection process.
 - The trial uniform should meet the specified dress code and be appropriate for the trial sessions.
- Traveling Uniform:

- Successful athletes who are chosen to represent Volleyball NZ during travel will receive a designated traveling uniform.
- The cost of the traveling uniform will be the responsibility of the athletes.
- Athletes will receive this at the earliest opportunity prior to travel
